

Sworn Statement: James C. Waincott

James C. Waincott being produced and duly sworn on the part of the State deposes and saith that it was after broad daylight when he helped Calie Catto the asked out of the fire place in her cabin on Sunday Morning - viz of June the 24th 1855 - that she called me from the Cherry ^{tree} when I was gathering

Cherries and said if I would help her carry the ashes out of her fire place in her Cabin she would give me two dozen walnuts. we carried them out and emptied them on the right hand side of the path leading from the Cabin to the stable. I did not notice any bones in the ashes when we emptied them out this
